SELECTED PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

Conducted analyses and produced regulatory reports for multiple clinical trials in the medical device and nutrition space. Trial experience includes power analyses, SAP development, endpoint analyses, reporting, and DSMB participation.

Performed study design, data management, and analyses of clinical and healthcare cost outcomes for hemodialysis patients using the United States Renal Data System (USRDS) and Medicare claims data. This effort required the combination of data from disparate sources, an understanding of Medicare claims billing and data processes, and the ability to communicate the strengths and limitations of the data sources.

Designed and implemented a technical solution for processing more than 300 digitized survival curves in a largescale meta-analysis of survival data using R and Stata. Solution used abstracted data to accommodate subgroup analyses directed by characterization of the studies.

Conducted the harmonization and management of data from multiple studies to perform a pooled analysis of growth and tolerance in formula-fed infants.
